This includes advocating for curriculum space, supporting educators, promoting equity and inclusion, advancing research, and sustaining SBS as a priority in evolving models of healthcare education.

BeSST will undertake an annual review process, publishing a Year in Review summary and progress report aligned with this strategic plan to be presented at the AGM. Midway through the cycle (Year 3), a strategic refresh will be conducted to ensure responsiveness to external changes.
